Be sure that you complete at least 45 credits at the 300 level or above. This means you must take at least 18 credits at the 300 level or above in your major, minor or electives outside the major/minor.

*300-level or above courses must include GER 304, either GER 401 or GER 402, one GER 480 and one GER 481 course, two literature courses, and two culture courses plus one elective. These courses may be taken in any order provided that prerequisites have been met.
